We at Seattle Theatre Group (producers of this event) want to express our immense and sincere gratitude to all who are supporting THING, particularly the residents of Port Townsend, our hosts at Fort Worden, the artists, volunteers, and of course, the attendees. It is our hope that patrons show up bright and early with an open mind and an appetite for checking out something new and different. This spirit of discovery is at the heart of THING. It is our belief that taking in a wide variety of arts and culture is

essential to a life well lived and perhaps even a path toward

better understanding each other. Since THING's maiden voyage in 2019 we have strived to improve representation on our stages and evolve to be more inclusive and accessible.

THING exists as a unique event in a unique part of the world. The Pacific Northwest has long earned a reputation for innovation and independence. We try to reflect this by programming an eclectic mix of established artists such as Modest Mouse, Sparks, Father John Misty and Jungle, alongside exciting rising stars such as Goose, Yves Tumor, Freddie Gibbs, and Wet Leg. We are thrilled to welcome several acclaimed international artists: Mdou Moctar (Nigeria), Jose Gonzalez (Sweden), Wet Leg (UK), Hiatus Kaiyote (Australia) as well as Arooj Aftab (US-based, first-ever Pakistani to win a Grammy!) and Lido Pimienta (Colombia-born, living in Canada).

It also remains a priority to shine a light on up-and-coming artists from the region: Delvon Lamarr Organ Trio (#1 on Downbeat Magazine's critics poll as Rising Star Organist), electrifying seven-piece rhythm-and-soul group The Dip, psychedelic electrocumbia artist Terror/Cactus, innovative rapper Jarv Dee, the versatile and jaw-dropping

vocals of Shaina Shepherd, and the scrappy indie rock sounds of Tacoma's acclaimed Enumclaw.

Seattle Theatre Group is a year-round nonprofit arts organization with three historic theatres and a robust slate of education and community programs, including the DANCE This camp which also take place at Fort Worden. Get a taste of what these programs offer by checking out a variety of workshops and showcases for our signature programs: DANCE This, More Music @ the Moore, and ELEVATE!

Beyond the music we invite you to explore Fort Worden and its 434 acres with 12 miles of forested hiking trails and two miles of walkable saltwater beaches. On the festival site you'll find a wide variety of "Other THINGs" to surprise and delight, including: The Future Is 0 (a satirical game show), a lecture deconstructing The Beatles' Revolver album, native storytellers Elaine Grinnell & Delbert Miller from the Jamestown S'klallam and Skokomish tribes, and Architects of Air who return to THING with a brandnew Luminarium (an inflatable sculpture of light and air) titled Timisien.

Lastly, it has been an unimaginable time for all of us. Don't forget to laugh. We are extremely fortunate to be joined by two present and future legends: Robert Smigel as Triumph The Insult Comic Dog and Jerrod Carmichael. Let's remind each other what it feels like to experience the joy of arts and culture with a community of people in the spectacular natural setting in which we are so lucky to live. CREATIVE ARTS ALLIANCE

The newly formed Creative Arts Alliance includes Centrum, Copper Canyon Press, Corvidae Press, KPTZ Radio, Madrona MindBody Institute, Northwind Art, Port Townsend School of Woodworking and Rainshadow Recording. These eight creative arts non-profit groups are making plans to reside in Fort Worden's historic newly renovated Makers Square, creating an arts and culture corridor on the campus. From classes to artists-in-residence to performances and movement, there are lots of activities, programming and events in which to engage.

New Opportunities for Creative Arts at Fort Worden

Among the many lessons of the past two+ years is that with resiliency and creativity, new opportunities are forged. This is the message offered by members of the newly formed Creative Alliance that is strengthening the creative arts and lifelong learning at Fort Worden.

Even before the pandemic, Centrum, Copper Canyon Press, Corvidae Press, Madrona MindBody, Northwind Art, the Port Townsend School of Woodworking and Rainshadow Recording shared ideas, resources and, occasionally, programming. Now joined by Jefferson County's community radio station KPTZ as it moves onto the campus, these eight organizations have aligned to better expand creative arts opportunities and to secure their future on the Fort Worden campus.

Foundational to this new future are long-term leases with the Public Development Authority (PDA) which manages Fort Worden on behalf of Washington State Parks. With that work largely complete, the group can approach funders to help renovate the buildings — many of which are 100+ years old — that Alliance members occupy.

"We are assuming responsibility for maintenance and capital repairs for our buildings," said Centrum's Executive Director Robert Birman, "so together, we will approach foundations and other grantors to upgrade these vital spaces. Collectively our voice is more compelling, and we hope to greatly expand investment in the campus for the long-term benefit of the community and our organizations."

In addition to raising an expected \$15 to \$20 million over the

next 20 years, the group is strategizing how to expand the scale and reach of arts programming. For example, the newly renovated Building 305, from where KPTZ will broadcast, is envisioned as a vibrant multi-purpose space that also can house art exhibitions and studio space, as well as curated shows, talks, lectures, and musical performances.

"This is very exciting for all of us involved with lifelong learning at Fort Worden," added Northwind Arts' Teresa Verraes. "We're eager to bring even more vibrant arts experiences to Port Townsend and those we reach beyond our community."



systemic racism and individuals challenging racist ideologies. Spokenword artists include Jazzmin Barrett and Rahma Mohammed (Friday), Harlem Yarbrough, Maya Russell, and Tia Nache Yarbrough (Saturday), and Chase Roberts, Kyle Danielson, and Gianni Johnson (Sunday).

DANCE THIS PERFORMANCE + WORKSHOPS

STG's signature dance program, now in its 24th year, DANCE This brings together youth & adult performers from diverse communities for collaboration & to share their culture through the art of dance. It is a multi-faceted program consisting of performance and training opportunities for all ages. THING Workshops include: "Breaking" with Robert Eyerman at 4:00pm on Friday, and "Afro Dance Workshop" with Niya

Cakpo at 4:00pm on Sunday. The DANCE This Showcase is Sunday at 12:30 and will feature performances by Northwest Tap Connection, Grupo Folklorico Herencias Mexicanas, and Afro Beats with Niyafath Cakpo & Michel Mughisa.



DANCE WITH LIFE WORKSHOP

Dance with Life are dance classes for people living with physical and cognitive challenges. The classes inspire students of all levels of ability and mobility to investigate movement and music in ways that engage their mind and body artistically, intellectually, and physically. Dance with Life classes contribute to the participants' health and

wellness, while addressing such concerns as balance, coordination, flexibility, and depression. A one-hour seated and standing workshop will be offered Saturday at 4:00pm led by teaching artists Angie Bolton and Kirsten Barron Kinney and accompanied by Travis Corwin.

STG's Education and Community Engagement
Teaching Artist Team provides training, workshops
and classes focused on personal and professional
development for the community in a wide
range of art disciplines. Experienced Teaching
Artists partner with schools, organizations and
communities to empower, enrich, and celebrate
participants' quality of life using the arts.
Teaching Artists modify experiences to meet all

comfort levels. One-hour workshops will be offered by STG teaching artists throughout THING and include "Improv for Wellness" with Teague Parker on Friday at 1:00pm, "Samba Music & Art" with Dora Newman on Saturday at 1:00pm, and "Musical Theatre Adventures" with Brad Walker & Gabi Shutt on Sunday at 1:00pm.

Frog clan and has created various Tlingit art
for over 40 years: dance robes, tunics, beading,
carving, with a focus on making elk hide drums
designed with her form line designs painted in
acrylic. Margie will be at THING (1:00pm to
6:00pm near the Parade Ground stage) painting
canvases with line form designs which will include
4 crests heads: Eagle, Raven, Wolf and Whale

along the edges. These pieces will invite festival goers to learn and contribute to the creation of the live painting experience.

STG's Commitment to Equity

Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, and Access (DEIA) are fundamental priorities for our organization and the communities we serve; therefore, we are committed to examining, challenging, and modifying our business practices.



⇒A full loop on the Boat Haven/Downtown/Uptown route takes about 45 minutes.

⇒The Craft Beverage Tour loop is about an hour.





Arrive early for THING and enjoy some of the fun activities the Olympic Peninsula and Port Townsend have to offer. Explore the outdoors, enjoy a variety of arts, music, & entertainment, and check out the local restaurants, wineries, and cider houses.

Reduce your carbon footprint and ride your bike to THING. Port Townsend and the surrounding area are very bicycle friendly with bike lanes, trails, and cycle mechanics prevalent throughout. The Cicmahan trail showcases the Indigenous history of the area and is bikeable from 1 to 12

Take the Kingston Ferry from Seattle to Kingston, along with your bike, then board the Kingston express Shuttle to Port Townsend. The entire trip takes less than 2 hours and is the fastest and least expensive route from Seattle to Port Townsend.



SOUNDCHECK

In the seven days leading up to THING, Port Townsend will be bursting with performances, art and interactive events celebrating local arts and culture. Soundcheck kicks off on Friday, August 19th with Band-o-Rama and runs through August 25th.
